# **Overcoming Fear**

What do you fear? What keeps you locked up, locked in, or locked away? Each of us have things that we fear—things that can lock us up in our own little rooms away from others. Fear can make life a prison. Fear is the fruit of unbelief and it happens whenever we trust in someone, something, or ourselves above God.

The disciples of Jesus were hiding out on that first Easter evening because of their fear. No doubt they not only feared those who crucified Jesus, but they were afraid because of the guilt of their sin. They abandoned their Lord in his moment of greatest need.

It's amazing to consider how the Lord approaches the disciples. His first words are words of comfort. "Peace be with you." His words give what they say—Peace! "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (John 14:27). His words bring peace in the midst of turmoil and unrest, "I have said this to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have trouble, but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).

One can only imagine the relief and peace the disciples must have felt. They had failed him in his hour of glory: none believed his words that he would rise from the dead on the third day; none of them trusted Jesus with his own death and resurrection. Yet, Jesus does not berate them for their unbelief or chide them for their lack of faith.

Instead, he comes humbly among them to speak his peace!

His peace is as real as the wounds in his body—the nail marks in his hands and feet, the scar of the spear that pierced his side. From those wounds comes an amazing peace. As Isaiah the prophet said, "The punishment that brought us peace was upon him and by his wounds we are healed."

There are so many things in this world that cause us to live in fear, to rob us of peace; and then we have our own sinfulness that causes us to cower in fear. Yet, each time we worship, the crucified and risen Lord is present with us to share his word, his wounds, and his peace. It's as if Jesus says to us, "These wounds are for you—by them you're healed from the disease of sin and death." Recall his words and his wounds when your life is in turmoil and confusion, when you're threatened and filled with fear, locked up in your room. His words and his wounds are our peace.

May each day bring you His Easter peace,



# **NOTES FROM THE PARISH NURSE**

Dear Friends in Christ:

DVT – Deep Vein Thrombosis (blood clot in large veins), Pulmonary Embolism (blockage caused by a blood clot that travels to the lungs), Venous thrombi (clots that occur in the arms or other areas), Emboli (clots that break up and travel through the blood stream)

Blood clots can kill. Blood clots are jellylike masses of protein, blood cells, and platelets. They can be life saving when they stop bleeding from an injury, but are deadly if they form where they aren't needed.

**Symptoms** include a burning or itching sensation if they are in a vein close to the skin's surface but usually don't lead to serious problems. Swelling

and inflammation can occur if they develop in a vein deep in the lower abdomen or legs and interfere with blood flow (DVT).

**Risks:** 1. Sitting longer than 6-8 hours (car or plane trips). 2. Limited mobility due to medical issues, surgery, or paralysis. 3. Injured vein from bone fracture, severe muscle injury, trauma or major surgery (abdominal, pelvic, hip or leg). 4. Having an IV for medication or other treatments (central venous catheter). 5. Heart failure or cancer in the abdomen. 6. Previous clots or family history. 7. Pregnancy, taking birth control pills or hormone replacement therapy for menopause symptoms. 8. Being older than 60. 9. Being overweight or obese. 10. High blood pressure. 11. Smoking. 12. Genetic factors or inherited blood-clotting disorders.

**Prevention:** 1. The usual healthy lifestyle routine – exercise, lose weight, quit smoking. 2. Exercise legs if on a trip and unable to get up. 3. Wear loose-fitting clothes to prevent restriction of blood flow. 4. Talk to your doctor before surgery. You may need anticoagulant medicine before of after to help reduce the risk.

# **Recognizing symptoms**

For DVT, there is swelling, pain, tenderness, redness of the lower leg or thigh (common) or arm (rare). Seek medical attention as soon as possible.

For Pulmonary Embolism, there is difficulty breathing, rapid or irregular heartbeat, chest pain or discomfort, coughing up blood and fainting spells. Go to an emergency room or call 911.

If a clot is suspected, tests will be run for confirmation – blood tests, CT scans, angiograms, or nuclear lung perfusion scan if you are allergic to the dye used in angiogram.

# **Options for treatment**

There are a variety of alternatives for treating a blood clot, depending on a number of factors, including its location in the body, the type of clot, and the patient's overall health. Listed below are some of the more common ones.

- Compression stockings insurance might not cover them, so be sure to check with your provider.
- Heparin given intravenously at a hospital or by injection. Carries a higher risk of internal bleeding than low-molecular-weight heparin.
- Low-molecular-weight herparin (Dalteparin (Fragmin), enoxaparin (Lovenox and generic) – there's a risk of internal bleeding; report any unusual bleeding or bruising to your doctor.
- Selective factor Xa inhibitors (Fondaparinux (Arixtra and generic), rivaroxaban (Xarelto))
   Both drugs reduce the risk of blood clots more than low-molecular-weight heparin, but may also increase the risk of bleeding. Fondaparinux is given intravenously or by injection; rivaroxaban is available as a pill.
- Surgery done only in rare cases.
- Thrombolytics (includes alteplase (Activase)) – used to treat life-threatening blood clots in the lungs.
- Warfarin (Coumadin, Jantoven, and generic)
   To reduce the risk of internal bleeding, don't start or stop any medications or dietary supplements without a doctor's approval. Eat a consistent diet and avoid eating unusually large amounts of food high in vitamin K, such as broccoli, collard greens, and kale. Report any unusual bleeding or bruising to a doctor.
