#### Walking in Truth

#### "Teach me your way, O Lord, and I will walk in your truth" (Psalm 86:11)

There are times when we find ourselves struggling because of the uncertainty that comes in daily life. Parents may spend countless hours awake late into the night because a child is out beyond curfew? You wonder if everything is all right—if only you could know the truth! Or the dating couple who's going through a difficult time may ask, does this person really care for me? Then there's the worried family who's anxious because a loved one is serving in the military half way around the world. If only you knew the truth, there could be an end to this agony.

There is a far deeper hunger for the truth that gnaws at the heart of every person. Even those who profess to have no religion will confess in honest moments the struggle that comes with uncertainty. In the presence of others that person may boast about the ability to get along without a faith in God. Or worse yet, that person may arrogantly assert that there is no God. But in the secret places of the heart, that person cannot stop the haunting question, "But what if there is a God?" Of course, this is the kind of question that leads to a multitude of other questions.

If there is a God, what kind of God is He? What does he think of me? How do I fit into his scheme within this universe? What's my personal relationship to him—and his to me? What will happen when I die? Is there a hell—if so how can I escape it? Is there a heaven—if so, how can I be assured of being there someday? These are a few of the questions that have plagued the hearts of people down through the ages. And they demand nothing less than the truth as their reply.

King David expresses one of the greatest longings of the heart when he prays in our Psalm, "Teach me your way, O Lord, and I will walk in your truth." If you think about it truth brings an end to the agony of uncertainty. King David, by God's grace, found relief for his uncertainty in the Lord. That's the same place we find relief from our uncertainty, the truth of Christ's Gospel!

Christ with his own lips has assured us that his Gospel is truth. "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples; then you will know the truth and the truth will set you free." Shortly before his crucifixion he assured his anxious disciples with these words: "I am the way and the truth and the life, no one comes to the Father except through me." He not only knows the truth, he not only has the truth, and he not only brings the truth, he is truth. In him our uncertainty finds the answers to the deepest problems of the soul.

In Christ God has intervened in our behalf, sending his only Son into the world to pay the penalty for our sins and to bring peace through the forgiveness of sins. To achieve this indescribable salvation, Jesus Christ was born, suffered, died and rose. By his suffering and death for our salvation he has given us an overwhelming demonstration of his and his Father's love for us. Assured of that love, we can rest assured of his continued guidance as we walk in his truth.

In your search for truth you need not look any further than Jesus. He is the Truth—heaven's eternal Truth, God's Truth to humanity, the only Truth by which we can set our course and be assured of an eternal destiny of pleasure and glory! So, we pray, "Teach me your way, O Lord, and I will walk in your truth."

God's blessings as you place yourself in a position to be taught by the Lord, that you might walk in His Truth.

#### A Note from the Parish Nurse

Dear Friends in Christ:

I attended the parish nurse conference this past May. A breakout session I attended dealt with domestic violence. Dr. Stephen Saunders, Professor of Psychology and the Director of Clinical Training at Marquette University and Sandra Ostapowich, Conference Executive for Higher Things, Inc. and a survivor of an 8 year abusive marriage were the presenters.

The session included statistics and definitions or types of abuse, understanding the abuser and the victim, starting difficult conversations, issues of safety, steps in helpful conversations, understanding and referring to resources/experts, and outreach.

The information obtained was overwhelming as the program was whittled down to  $2 \frac{1}{2}$  hours from 8-9 hours. There is a website – lcms.org/socialissues – where the information can be viewed. There were two members of the audience who relayed their own stories of survival. It is important to remember than

anyone sitting in the pew next to you could be either an abuser or a victim. Christians are not immune from this tragedy.

May God continue to bless us.
