



Mary Martha News

Pastor Schulz opened our meeting with the story of Mary and Martha, who were disappointed when Jesus did not come immediately when their brother Lazarus was sick. Jesus answered that Lazarus' sickness would not end in death, but it was for God's glory, so that God's son would be glorified through it. Lazarus DID die and was in his tomb for four days before Jesus arrived. Jesus called to him to come out of his tomb and as Lazarus responded, his resurrection proved to the people who witnessed this that God would show mercy to those who believed in Him as well as in His Son, Jesus.

Our speaker for this meeting was Pam Johnson. In 1994, her mother was suffering with terminal cancer and one day she suddenly visualized that her mother was speaking to her, telling her she couldn't lose if she lived on or died now, since her death would save her from much pain and suffering. The word 5pm also came to her and later she found that her mother had died in a car accident at exactly that time – 5pm. She had a vision of angels singing in an aura of rainbows and she wrote down the words they sang and truly believes those words were sent to her from heaven.

As time went on, she had more visions of angels and she produced a booklet called "Songs of Angels" which came to her – from 16 angels – 16 verses. As the next ten years went by, she received further visions, many times awakening in the middle of the night to write down what came to her from the angels she firmly believes in. That book was passed among our members and was extremely impressive. She has been criticized for her beliefs and called a Bible stumper and she went to seek psychiatric treatment, thinking she might be crazy, but was told she had a spiritual calling and that she should listen to what God is telling her to do. She feels she needs to share the many visions she has experienced to build a stronger Christian awareness of how angels can help make our world a better place in which to live, but she has not yet decided how this can best

be accomplished and she asks that we pray for her continued work.

We were told that Ann Fredericks, one of our founding members, is now recovering from her knee surgery, the heart attack she suffered after that surgery and the allergic reaction to the medication she had been given.

Hostesses were Nancy Rammer and JoAnne Barzen who replaced her sister, Marge Seifert, who was unable to serve because her husband, Wayne, had been placed in hospice care. The tables were decorated with daffodils and we were treated to a delicious gluten-free cupcake as well as an equally delicious chocolate chip cookie. Parish Nurse News

Dear Friends in Christ –

Blessings to all the men in honor of Father's Day.

Age-Related Macular Degeneration (AMD) is a chronic disease affecting your eyes. It develops when tissues of the macula deteriorate. It affects the central portion of vision. There is no cure, however the most common form develops gradually, and improved treatments help delay vision loss, preserve what you have and sometimes may reverse some vision loss.

Dry vs Wet AMD

Dry – more common, cause not entirely known, clumps of cellular waste (drusen) appear on macula, small amounts may develop without causing effects on vision. Larger drusen may merge together leading to breakdown of light-sensitive cells and gradual vision loss.

Wet – always starts as Dry, at some point abnormal blood vessels begin to grow and may leak blood and fluid beneath macular tissue.

Symptoms for both types are essentially the same but Wet may cause deterioration of sight within weeks or months while Dry over years or decades. Dry typically affects both eyes simultaneously. Wet often starts with symptoms in one eye and has a high risk of the other eye being affected.




NORMAL VISION

Objects are unobstructed and clear


MACULAR DEGENERATION

At left, the healthy eye results in clear vision. At right, deteriorated central vision occurs with advanced macular degeneration. The hallmark sign of dry AMD is clumps of cellular waste (drusen), seen as yellow spots in the macula, causing swelling and

blistering and eventually damage and scarring. Someone in the early stages of macular degeneration may see distorted grid lines (right). Someone with normal vision would see a grid that doesn't have distorted lines (left). *British Medical Journal of Ophthalmology*, 1953.

There is no surefire prevention for AMD, but leading a healthy lifestyle may reduce risk and slow progress. (Info taken from May Clinic Health Letter, June 2018)
